POLICY:

Lapeer County Community Mental Health (LCCMH) is smoke-free and prohibits smoking on any LCCMH-operated service sites.

STANDARDS:

- A. LCCMH is committed to promoting the whole health of the person served.
- B. Smoking in any LCCMH office, treatment building, or vehicles (LCCMH or County vehicles) is strictly prohibited to promote a healthy work and treatment environment and to comply with Michigan Public Act 198 of 1987, the Michigan Clean Indoor Air Act (MCIAA) (Part 126 of Public Act 368 of 1978, as amended), the Michigan Smoke-Free Air Law (Dr. Ron Davis Act of 2009) and CARF Standards.
- C. Smoking or vaping tobacco/nicotine products (e-liquids, e-cigarettes, vaporizers, or other electronic nicotine delivery systems), non-nicotine products, or marijuana products are not permitted on any LCCMH-operated sites. See Policy 05.003.20 Safe and Drug-Free Agency.

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- D. Nicotine Replacement Therapies (NRT) used for smoking cessation are acceptable for use at LCCMH. NRT includes but is not limited to transdermal patches, gum, nasal inhalers/sprays, and lozenges.
- E. The sale of tobacco products is prohibited within LCCMH offices, treatment buildings, and vehicles.

DEFINITIONS:

Tobacco Product- Any product made or derived from tobacco intended for human consumption, including any component, part, or accessory of a tobacco product. This includes among other products, cigarettes, cigarette tobacco, roll-your-own tobacco, and smokeless tobacco. (FDA definition January 8, 2016)

Nicotine Product: Any product derived from the dried, fermented tobacco leaf. Nicotine is a poisonous chemical that stimulates the adrenal glands to release the hormone epinephrine and increases the level of dopamine in the body.

Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT): NRT includes but is not limited to transdermal patches, gum, nasal inhalers/sprays, and lozenges.

Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS)- Noncombustible tobacco products

E-Liquid- A liquid used in ENDS and may contain nicotine as well as varying compositions of flavorings, propylene glycol, vegetable glycerin, and other ingredients. The liquid is heated to create an aerosol the user inhales.
