

CCBHC Grant Update

In September 2022, Lapeer County Community Mental Health (LCCMH) was awarded a four-year Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) Planning, Development, and Implementation Grant through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The purpose of a CCBHC is to ensure access to coordinated, comprehensive behavioral health care by prioritizing evidence-based services, quick access to treatment, and care coordination of behavioral health care, physical health care, social services, and other community resources.

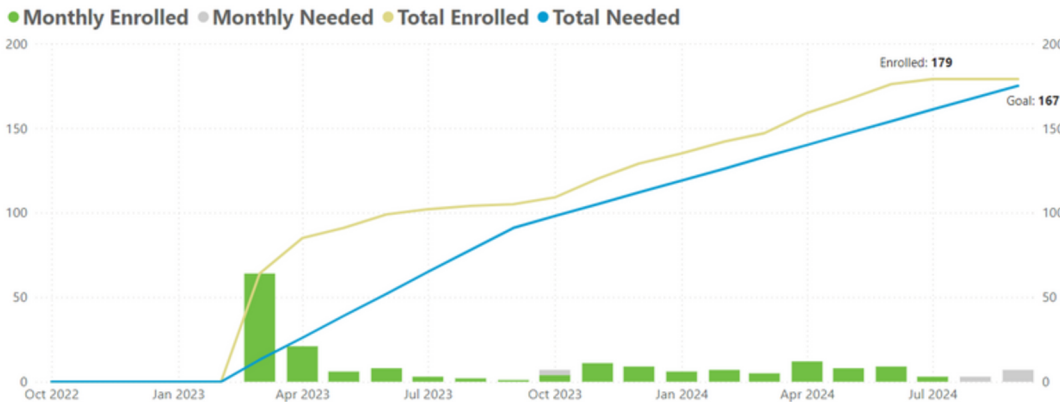
Grant Enrollment

LCCMH has met the year two grant enrollment goal

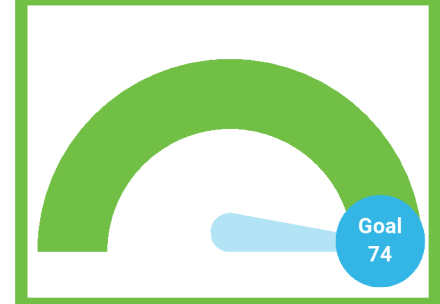
Grant Cycle

Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors

The **Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors (LOSS)** team is a community-based initiative dedicated to providing immediate support and resources to individuals and families affected by suicide. Our mission is to offer compassionate care, hope, and healing to those in the aftermath of a suicide loss, so they do not have to navigate this difficult time alone. Lapeer County LOSS is composed of survivors of suicide who offer help and hope to navigate grief and begin the healing process.

Key Objectives:

- 1. Immediate Response:** Providing prompt and compassionate support to survivors shortly after a suicide loss, often within 24-72 hours
- 2. Emotional Support:** Offering a listening ear, comfort, and understanding to those grieving a loss to suicide
- 3. Resource Connection:** Connecting survivors with local resources, including counseling, support groups, and mental health services
- 4. Community Education:** Raising awareness about suicide prevention and the needs of suicide survivors through educational programs and outreach
- 5. Ongoing Support:** Ensuring continuous care and follow-up with survivors to assist them in their healing journey

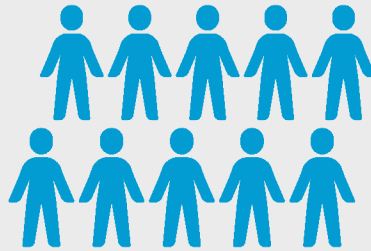

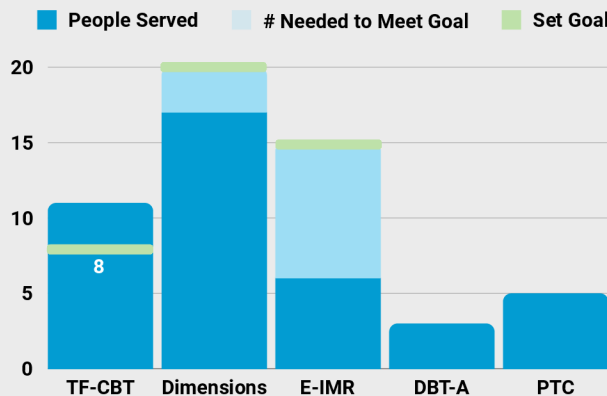
The number of advisory council members who are persons served/family members
